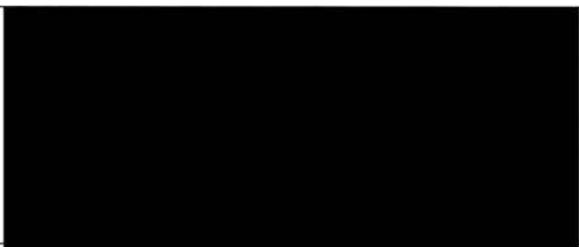

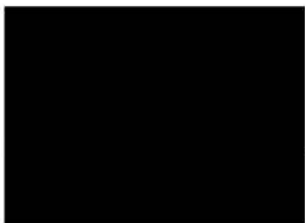

LIQUOR CONTROL ADVISORY COUNCIL
HARM REDUCTION STRATEGIES WORKING GROUP
TERMS OF REFERENCE

Purpose

The Minister for Consumer Affairs, Gaming & Liquor Regulation has asked the Council to provide her with advice on what alcohol-related harm reduction strategies could be trialled in Victoria and where trials could be undertaken

The purpose of the working group is to consider options for the Council to recommend to the Minister in relation to initiatives to be trialled and locations that may be suitable to undertake those trials.

Background

As part of its 2014 work plan the Council considered the future of the freeze on late-night liquor licences.

In its final report to the Minister, the Council recommended extending the freeze and trialling and evaluating other policy initiatives to reduce alcohol related harm in high-risk areas.

Tasks

The working group will:

- (i) develop a detailed work plan including deliverables, dates and success measures
- (ii) examine the evidence base for targeted initiatives and identify initiatives for the Council to recommend to the Minister as suitable for trialling
- (iii) consider options for identifying trial areas including identification based on risk of alcohol-related harm, including place based and family violence
- (iv) identify areas for the Council to recommend to the Minister as suitable for the conduct of trials
- (v) make recommendations to the Council on the above matters.

Reporting

The working group will report to the Council.
