I was attacked years ago my ex-partner (more mother). I was also attacked by my father's (she was more from his first marriage, and I was a child of his second marriage).

I have had weekend custody and holiday custody, since the.

I used average lawyers, a company in the local lawyers, so they all had a conflict of interest. I had to take her to court about 30 or 40 times to get custody matters resolved. If the did not show up with the kids for the weekend, I had to make an appointment with the weekend (which often took a week). I found that inadequate. I think all solicitors should have an after-hours number so that you can make an appointment that weekend (rather than wait for the weekend to finish, and then wait a week for an appointment). The legal fees were paid by Aboriginal Legal Aid.

After three years with **Constant** I started using FVPLS. I saw a wonderful lawyer called **She is the** best solicitor I have ever had. She is now working in **Constant**. **Constant** actually came and gave me a home visit. She was able to see how the family dynamics actually worked. She arranged for the **constant** to come every second weekend and half the holidays.

In **second**, I had a **second second second**. Because I was ill, I had to stop seeing the kids for a little while. My ex asked her solicitors to get full custody of my **second**. Every time I show a bit of weakness, she tries for full custody.

Because of my transplant, I had to be very careful about getting sick. The helped me amend the orders so that I had to be notified if any of the kids had a cold. Was always trying to send the over with a cold.

The police man said, "What are you guys starting now?" That got right under my bee. I said, how dare you walk into my house and say I've started something without talking to your colleagues. It was unprofessional. I said, "If you don't leave, you'll be locking me up." I was the one who was assaulted, and yet the copper heard **the police** version of events and accused me of starting the argument.

I was worried about whether the assault would damage my transplant. The next day I went to the police station and made a statement. A couple of other people made statements too. All of the statements were a bit different. Three or four weeks later, **statement** and **statement** went to the police station and made carbon copy statements (they had three weeks to get their story air tight).

I believe all parties should be tested for drugs and alcohol at the time of the violent incident.

The matter finally went to court. I got a 12 month restraining order on **and and**, and I was going to put one on **and and** as well. The solicitor I had at the time told me that if I got a restraining order against **and**, then **and** my two **and** would become homeless because they were living in such close proximity. So I had to drop the restraining order against **because** they would be homeless (and that would not be beneficial to the **and**.

The assault charge was proven against **example**. I made a claim for Victims of Crime. 12 months later it was approved.

My wife, and I left town. I went to see my lawyer, and the lawyer said the best thing you can do is back off for 12 months until everything dies down.

I've been in for years now. I see the on weekends every now and again.

One night went out drinking and left the kids and her wear old at home (a wear old, a wear old and a wear old at home alone). I called the coppers, and they went around. I came home. I asked the coppers to drug and alcohol test her, but they refused because she hadn't been driving.

I don't find out until after the fact. It's hard to prove a breach if it's not iron clad. Sometimes it seems like the law is only there for you if you're a criminal.

I've had a few different lawyers in the past. Some have been very helpful. Others treat you like you're just a number. The lawyers who are more courteous are the ones I remember. The word I would use is compassionate. They don't mollycoddle, but they make the process much easier. The others, who treat you like a number, make you feel like you need a Thesaurus to understand what they're saying.

We need more lawyers who are down to earth and that are able to explain the process without using big words.

Suggestions for the future

- In family violence matters, both parties should be drug and alcohol tested.
- Both parties should have the opportunity to do rehab and drug and alcohol testing.
- Parenting orders should be made on the basis of who is more maternal.
- The police should be more diplomatic. If an AVO is breached, the breaching person should be arrested. Too many people get away with blue murder.
- I'm disabled, I've had a **second second second second**. I have a carer. It's hard to tell my kids why I need a carer. It's easier to call my carer my partner. If you need a carer to look after yourself, how are you going to look after your kids? My carer lives with me. She doesn't want nothing to do with my legal problems.
- Local courts should hear family violence matters more days of the week. There should be more circuits.
- Police should have more authority to act if a family is arguing. They should be able to automatically drug test people, or confiscate their alcohol.
