
Family Violence

	The perpetrators problem with Alcohol still continues today and his behaviour has had
	NO change, despite loosing his license, he still drives
	with No licence with the children in the car and he still has been awarded access to my
	grandchildren.

	The chronic pain is still ongoing to this day.
	He verbally threatened me and my family stating, "I will get you, and the kids".
	The threat was meant to harm as he was very angry. My son in law was their and
	saved my life. The police were called and came around.



Alot of Government agencies are not doing their jobs but they are happy to be paid by the government. The Law enforcement are not performing. They perform better on a speeding fine. The lawyers told my daughter it will ALL be over in months, although she and our family have dealt with this psychological trauma for years and even though the final court hearing happened it is still not in favour of the children. The Perpetrator sees them every second weekend, disappointing the children as they cannot play sport or see their friends or us. They hate the travel of hours their and hours back. He remains drinking and he remains driving without a licence when he chooses too with the children in the car. The children voiced this to the Independent Children's Lawyer and to the Victoria Police but they are not listened too. If the perpetrator doesn't get what he wants he yells, swears and gets angry. He is very intimidating. All these people who work under the government body know how to talk, but they don't know how to act and this is why people are assaulted/loosing their life as a consequence of NO Action.

What are the improvements needed?

- Dismiss ALL Government agencies and start again. Have them ALL in the one facility, not scattered all over the place. Such as Legal Aid, Counsellors, Victims of Crime, Police who are specialised in the area to do statements and to enforce actions when needed and women's domestic violence team.
- The Government Agencies need to be LIMITED as there are too many and they are all living off the government and sending victims in circles. They are draining the allocation funds with NO results. Streamline it with results.
- The victim deserves to be heard and their should be **NO legal limit of cost**. Although the lawyers need to be accountable of their commitment to conclude the case within a reasonable time (12 months) but for this to happen the IVO's need to be taken seriously and acted upon or else this is why the victim is given their file at the end and said," Represent yourself" What a disgrace. The lawyers are living on this funding and money from the perpetrator to 'fuel the fire' to keep it going and they have no remorse to hand it over to the poor victim when the funds are exhausted.
- ALL Police need to be <u>schooled</u> in the area of Domestic Violence, not a Band Aid approach which is currently being done.
- My assault should never have occurred, if his behaviour was acted upon and dealt with. Such as 'if you don't put the fire under control, it will rage and this perpetrator rages and I am still concerned to this day as he continually says, "I'm going to get you, your daughter and the kids" The police are aware of this statement as I have heard said to me twice and my daughter has heard it many of times, but because it is not the word 'kill' they are not concerned. I am concerned because it's the way he

said it and the way it is meant, he has already been over at my house walking around taking photos when I had an IVO on him. He is an intimidating angry man who is fuelled very easily especially with Alcohol.

- I would like the children to have appropriate representation.
 - -When the children go to school and onwards, they are represented with their own lawyer, who specialises in the field with no connection, with the perpetrators or victims lawyer. They must be independent with no conflict of interest. The child is given three lawyers to meet and they pick the one they feel they can trust with the school councillor and principle to help with their journey. It is on a waiting list to see someone as does not want to go to the perpetrators house every second weekend. The has to go at present because if he doesn't my daughter will loose the children.
 - -Little ones below school age are represented with the maternal child health nurse and a lawyer.
 - DHS are not pro active, they allow violence to continue within the homes. They
 document but do nothing.
 - (Is a public flogging needed like the old days to bring them back in line, such as in the public square at 1000hrs)
 Why should anyone get hurt and allow the perpetrator to continue to walk around continuing their actions.
